<u>Introduction</u>: As we draw closer to Christmas our minds and hearts center on the miraculous birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Through his birth, life, death and resurrection, Jesus brought salvation to all people. Many of us have received, believed and experienced this new birth – which is amazing! But, have we truly been born of God? I'll let you in on a secret. Being born of God is not a onetime experience, but an ongoing renewal and walk with our Lord and King. So, are you truly born of God?

Scripture Reading: John 1:9-13

I. The True Light is Not <u>Partial</u>.

The true light, which gives light to **everyone**, was coming into the world (John 1:9).

I have come into the world **as light**, so that **whoever believes in me** may not remain in darkness (John 12:46).

For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people (Titus 2:11).

- II. The World was Made Through Him

 He was in the world, and the world was made through him... (John 1:10a).
- III. Three Camps
 - A. The world.

...yet the world did not know him (John 1:10b).

- ¹⁹ And this is the judgment: **the light has come into the world**, and people **loved the darkness** rather than the light because their **works were evil**. ²⁰ For everyone who does wicked things **hates the light** and does not come to the light, lest **his works should be exposed** (John 3:19–20).
- B. The knowing but unreceiving.

 He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him (John 1:11).

⁴⁴ The next Sabbath almost the whole city gathered **to hear the word of the Lord**. ⁴⁵ But when **the Jews saw** the crowds, they were **filled with jealousy** and began to contradict what was spoken by Paul, reviling him. ⁴⁶ And Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, saying, "It was necessary that **the word of God be spoken first to you**. Since you thrust it aside and judge yourselves unworthy of eternal life, behold, **we are turning to the Gentiles** (Acts 13:44–46).

C. The privileged.

¹² But to **all who did receive him**, who **believed in his name**, he **gave the right** to become children of God, ¹³ **who were born**, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, **but of God** (John 1:12–13).

What Type of Children Ought We to Be?

Those born of God...

1. do not keep on sinning.

No one born of God **makes a practice of sinning**, for God's seed abides in him; and **he cannot keep on sinning**, because he has been **born of God** (1 John 3:9).

2. love one another.

Beloved, let us **love one another**, for love is from God, and **whoever loves** has been **born of God** and knows God (1 John 4:7).

3. believe in Jesus and love God.

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been **born of God**, and everyone who loves the Father loves whoever has been born of him (1 John 5:1).

4. overcome the world.

For everyone who has been **born of God overcomes the world**. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—**our faith** (1 John 5:4).

5. desire his protection.

We know that everyone who has been **born of God** does not keep on sinning, but he who was **born of God protects him**, and **the evil one does not touch him** (1 John 5:18).

IV. Born of the Word

Then Pilate said to him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this purpose I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice" (John 18:37).

since you have been **born again**, not of perishable seed but of imperishable, through the **living** and **abiding word of God** (1 Peter 1:23).

⁴⁴ And Jesus cried out and said, "Whoever **believes in me**, believes not in me but in **him who sent me**. ⁴⁵ And whoever sees me **sees him who sent me**. ⁴⁶ **I have come into the world as light**, so that **whoever believes** in me **may not remain in darkness**. ⁴⁷ If anyone **hears my words** and does not keep them, I do not judge him; for I did not come to judge the world but to save the world. ⁴⁸ **The one who rejects me** and does not receive **my words** has a judge;

the word that I have spoken **will judge him on the last day**. ⁴⁹ For I have not spoken on my own authority, but the Father who sent me has himself given me a commandment—**what to say** and **what to speak**. ⁵⁰ And I know that his commandment is eternal life. **What I say**, therefore, **I say as the Father has told me**" (John 12:44–50).

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
